Dear St. Thomas Family,

I am going to state the obvious: we are a small congregation. We have an average weekly attendance of a bit less than 40. We have a limited number of programs that we can offer our members. We don't have a big budget that allows us to fund a lot of fancy bells and whistles to attract the attention of the multitudes. But all of this is OK. We have a heart for Christian service and outreach to our community.

We may be small, but we contribute a great deal in terms of time, talent, and treasure offered by our members to various local ministries in our community. This allows us to serve in a variety of ways and join forces with other like-minded folks in the Christiansburg area to have a profound and positive effect on those in need. Working with established organizations is a smart way for a small congregation like ours to do Christian ministry.

We have a long-standing relationship with several partner organizations like the Montgomery County Emergency Assistance Program (MCEAP), for which we collect non-perishable items for their food pantry, which we bring to our alter on Hospitality Sundays. Some members have also volunteered at the MCEAP Thrift Store and Home Store.

This time of year, we collect peanut butter and canned fruits to donate to the Montgomery County Christmas Store, which helps hundreds of our neighbors with extra food and other items during the holidays. The Christmas Store provides an atmosphere of dignity, privacy, and abundance that it is hoped offers a experience of the joy of the season.

During the school year we collect snacks for the local "backpack program" that sends students home with food for the weekend and over breaks. It is hoped that this provides some relief to our neighbors who are not always food-secure. We have for many years also participated with To Our House, a local outreach organization that provides shelter and food during the winter months in Christiansburg. This ministry is in partnership with our friends at Our Saviour Lutheran Church.

More recently a group of St. Thomas members have formed a cooking team that participates with Room at the Table (RATT) which is a ministry that provides hot meals to go once a week at Christiansburg Presbyterian Church. The supplies for these meals are funded through the outreach budget of St. Thomas.

This year at our annual St. Francis Blessing of the Animals, we are collecting donated pet food that will be donated the Montgomery County Animal Care and Adoption Center. Our ministries extend even to our four-footed friends.

Our building is also an important ministry of St. Thomas. Three times a week we host Narcotics Anonymous meetings. This is a very well established ministry and we have offered a secure and comfortable place for the important work of recovery.

At St. Thomas we have much to be thankful for and especially for the Spirit of love that guides us in our common lives together.
