Dear St. Thomas Family,

I like to say that holidays are special days when we celebrate something that we should really celebrate every day. Thanksgiving holds a central role in the worship and spiritual life of the Episcopal Church. Rooted in both scripture and tradition, the act of giving thanks is woven into the fabric of our liturgy, theology, and daily practice. Far beyond the observance of the national Thanksgiving holiday, thanksgiving in the Episcopal tradition is seen as a vital expression of faith and a response to God's grace.

The Book of Common Prayer is filled with prayers of gratitude, acknowledging God as the source of all blessings. The Eucharist, the central act of Christian worship in our Episcopal tradition, derives its name from the Greek word "eucharista," meaning "thanksgiving." This sacrament commemorates Christ's sacrifice and offers thanks for God's saving love. Each Eucharist is both an offering of praise and a communal act of thanksgiving, reminding worshipers of God's continual presence and generosity.

The General Thanksgiving, found in Morning and Evening Prayer, is a beloved prayer that encapsulates the Episcopal approach to gratitude: "We thank you for our creation, preservation, and all the blessings of this life..." This prayer not only recognizes material and spiritual gifts but also encourages worshipers to respond with lives of service and love.

Beyond corporate worship, thanksgiving is encouraged as a daily practice. Personal prayers often begin and end with words of thanks, fostering a habit of gratitude that shapes our outlook and actions. The church teaches that regular thanksgiving nurtures humility, combats entitlement, and opens the heart to God's presence in everyday life. Thanksgiving is transformative, deepening one's awareness of God's blessings and inspiring acts of kindness and justice.

Thanksgiving also informs our commitment to outreach and service. Recognizing that all blessings are gifts from God, we are called to share generously with others, especially those in need.

Thanksgiving is more than a liturgical element or annual observance in our Episcopal tradition—it is a way of life. Through worship, prayer, and acts of service, we strive to cultivate gratitude as a response to God's grace. This practice not only strengthens faith but also builds compassionate communities, making thanksgiving an indispensable part of Christian identity and spirituality.

In this season of thanksgiving, I am grateful especially thankful for our St. Thomas family and the spirit of love that binds us in mutual affection and support. God has blessed us richly.

Veterans Day Holy Eucharist & Commissioning of Chaplains

Episcopalians are invited to join a first-time churchwide Veterans Day Holy Eucharist service at 7 p.m. ET Nov. 11—via livestream or in person at the Church Center chapel in New York City—to honor those who have served in the military and specially recognize the Episcopal chaplains who support them.

Presiding Bishop Sean Rowe will preside, and the Rt. Rev. Ann Ritonia, bishop suffragan for the church's Armed Forces and Federal Ministries, will preach. The service will include a special "commissioning for further service" of chaplains who serve military veterans in all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces.
