Dear St. Thomas Family,

I think the vast majority of you would agree with me that we have had enough of the cold weather and ice. I can't remember the last time we had to cancel in person worship two Sundays in a row. One thing we learned during the pandemic was how to convene online. We did that once on Zoom and then you had the opportunity to join the closing Eucharist of the 107th annual convention of the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia.

It was a momentous and historic convention, because we elected the Reverend Karin McPhail our seventh diocesan bishop, and the first female to hold that office. Karin is already one of us, having served as rector of St. Elizabeth's Church, Roanoke for the past eight years. It only took three ballots to choose her from among a very impressive and deserving slate of candidates. Her consecration will be at St. John's in Roanoke in June. (June is something to look forward to from a February point of view, right?) She brings wonderful gifts and experience to her new leadership role, and we will be keeping her in our prayers.

In the meantime, the season of Lent is rapidly approaching. Ash Wednesday is February 18, a mere two weeks away. As is our custom, we will be gathering for *Koinonia* in the homes of members, beginning Wednesday, February 25 at Val Tweedie's. This year our theme will be *An Unlikely Lent: An Invitation to a Different Type of Lenten Journey*. We will consider some of the "lesser" characters in the story leading up to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Oh yeah, and we'll also enjoy each other's company and share a meal together. I hope you can join us and please keep a look out in announcements for further details.

Another wonderful and recurring opportunity for Lenten reflection is a Quiet Day hosted by our Ann Frances chapter of the Daughters of the King. I will be leading this one and it will also have an "unlikely" theme: *Unlikely Courage: the Women at the Cross*. This quiet time together will be held on Saturday, February 21, beginning at 8:45 in the church. Over the years, these have become one of my favorite happenings at St. Thomas, and I encourage you to join us.

The days will get longer and warmer over the coming weeks. In this time of uncertainty, concern, and fear, coming together in the name of Jesus is a powerful source of peace and balance. St. Thomas is a family dedicated to sharing the love of God and shining the light of Christ in a sometimes cold and dark world.
